A: With tomato paste!

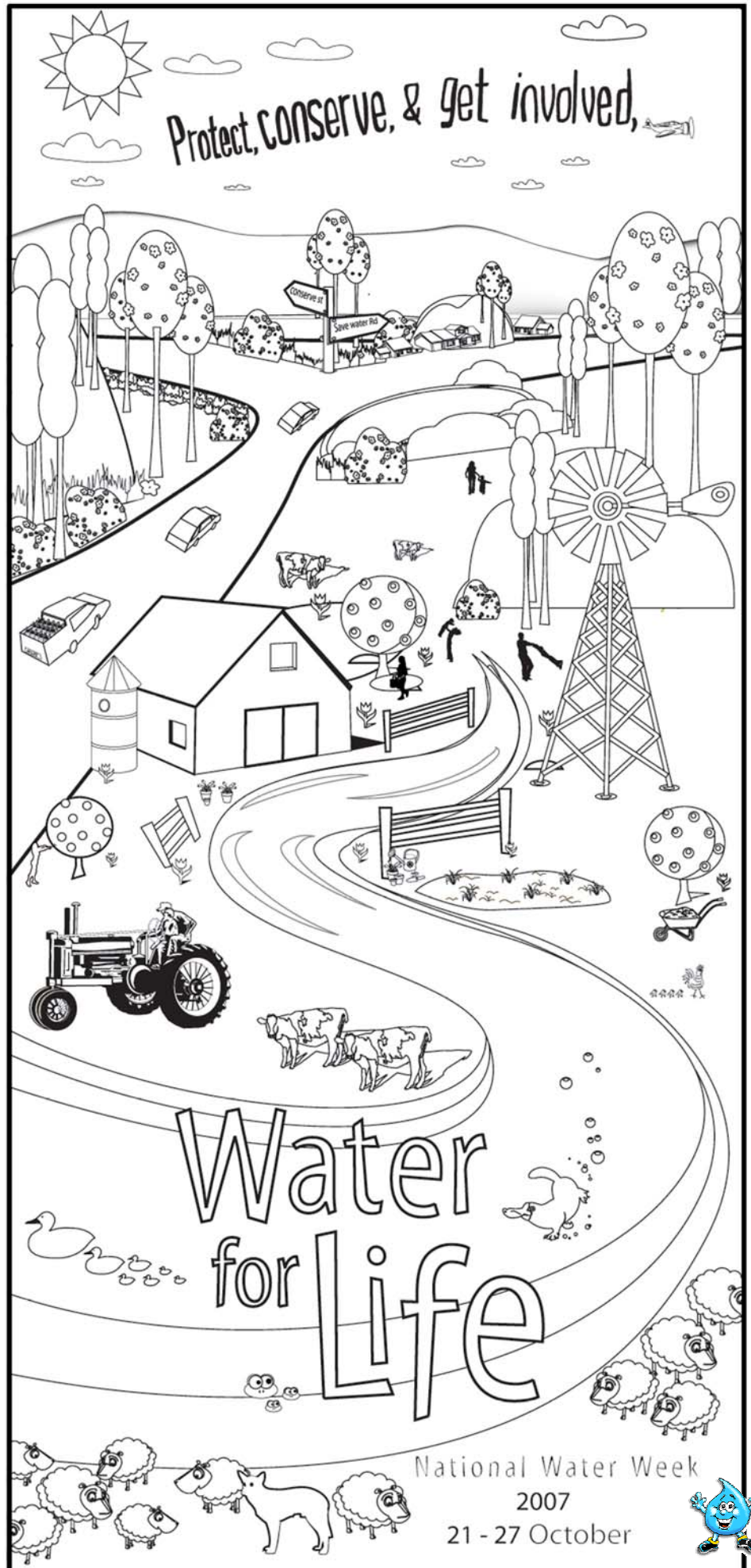
Q: Why did the elephant paint her toenails red?

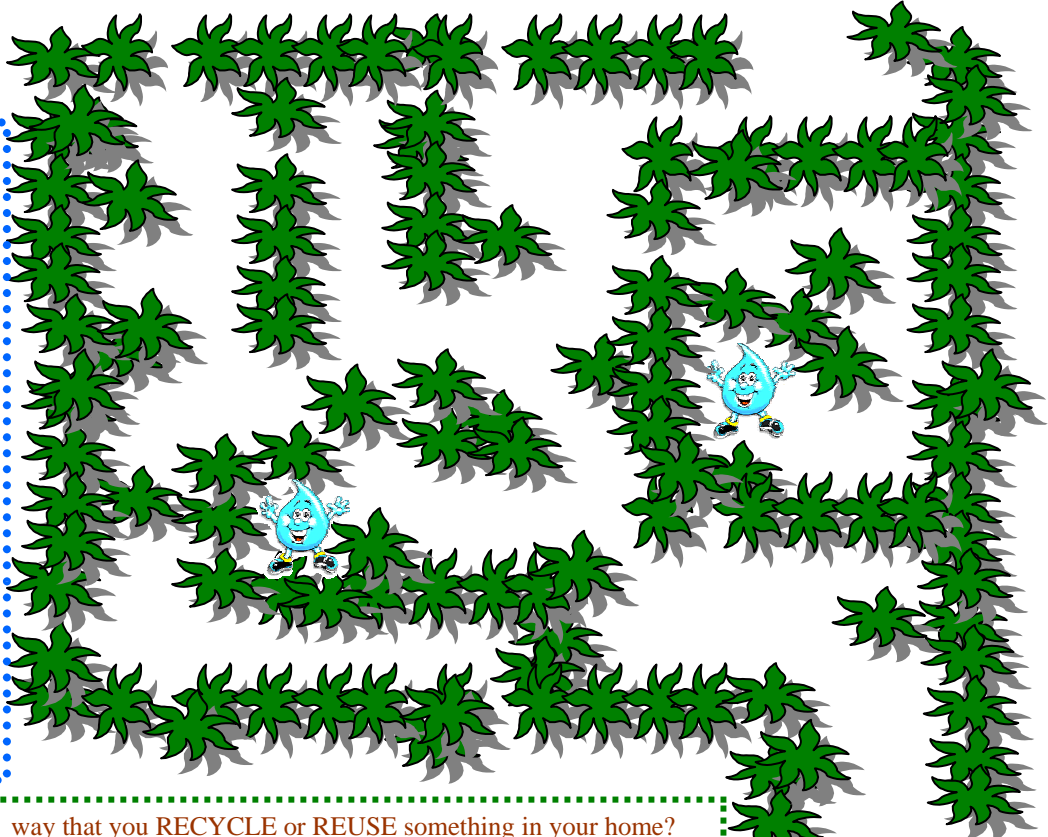
Being WaterWise is a Winner!
